

Dear Parents

As we commence the academic session 2026-2027 we would like to inform you about the promotion policy in class X, where we follow the assessment pattern as per the CBSE guidelines. Following is the assessment criteria for class X. We request you to go through the same, along with your ward, and ensure that they follow the same to attain their optimum potential.

Component	Weightage
Internal Assessment: 1. Weekly Test (35+35 marks) 2. Multiple Assessment (10 marks) 3. ALS/Subject Enrichment Activity (10 marks) 4. Portfolio (10 marks) A total of 100 marks will be reduced to 20 marks for the internal assessments.	20 marks
Mid-Term / Pre-Board Examination	80 marks

It has been observed that students take their Internal Assessments lightly and do not participate in subject enrichment activities or submit assignments on time. We would like to inform you that Internal Assessment has a **direct impact** on the **Final Result of your ward**. We would, therefore, advise you to kindly go through the following instructions carefully:

1. Examination

- Following assessments will be carried out throughout the session as per the schedule given

ASSESSMENT	MARKS	MONTH
Periodic test 1	35 +35	April - August
Mid Term Examination	80	September
Revision Tests	40	November
Pre Board Examination I	80	December
Pre Board Examination II	80	January-February

- The student has **to** appear for **each** of the periodic tests, Mid-Term Examination and Pre-Board Examination.
- Marks of Internal assessment will be added to the Mid-term Examination and Pre-Board Examination.
- Final Examination will be based on the complete syllabus of Class X and will be conducted by CBSE.
- If a student misses any test/ examination she/he will be awarded ZERO for the same.
- NO RETEST** will be allowed, under any circumstances, except if the student is representing the school in a co-curricular activity.

2. Pass Criteria

- In order to be declared as having passed Class X Examination, a student **must obtain a minimum of 33% marks** in **both** the Internal Assessment **and** the Board Examination and in each of the five subjects individually.
- If a student scores less than 33% in one subject, it will be considered as compartment, and she/he will have to write the compartment exam and score above 33% in it for promotion to Class XI. The exam will be conducted by CBSE.
- If a student scores less than 33% in two or more subjects, she/he will be considered detained in Class X.
- A printed performance profile will be given after the Mid-term and Pre Board Examinations. It will reflect the marks and grades scored by the student in internal assessments and the term examinations.
- The Final Examination performance profile will be issued by CBSE in April/May 2027.

3. Co-Scholastic Assessment

- Co-Scholastic assessment will be based on a five point grading scale which will include Art Education and Health and Physical Education. Health and Physical Education will include assessment in individual games, group games, physical exercises and a component of Social Empowerment through Work Education and Action, i.e the NSS activities undertaken by students in Classes IX and X.

4. Stream Allocation Criteria in Class XI

- In Class XI the factors deciding the allotment of stream and subject will be the students' academic performance in the **written test in Mid -Term and Pre-Board Examinations in Class X**, and their individual preferences. It is imperative that, as parents, you give due importance to your ward's academic performance throughout the year so that she/he qualifies for the stream she/he aspires for. The students are allowed to change their stream after Class X examination results in May, provided they score the grades required for the stream preferred by them.

The subject options in the three streams are as follows:-

Please Note: English Core is compulsory for all streams. Students opting for Science with Economics or Computer Science will have to compulsorily study Mathematics too. Economics / Psychology will be offered on first come first served basis at the time of registration, due to limited seats.
